


100 Days of Lockdown

Reaching Hindu Tribal Areas with the Gospel

For the past several months, Rev David Park (Mission Board secretary) has had the privilege of preaching the Gospel, almost every week, to a group in Pakistan. Those being reached are mostly Hindu tribal people, with some Muslim individuals, in remote, desert areas. The preaching is conducted through a phone video link-up. A dear sister, Deep, who comes from a converted Hindu background, has a deep burden to reach her people with the message of Christ.

After the presentation of the Gospel, a

simple meal called 'Biryani,' a popular dish in Pakistan and throughout the Indian subcontinent, is provided for the congregation. The meal is most welcome as most of the congregation are poor people working in conditions of slavery to Muslim landlords.

We rejoice that several people have professed faith in Christ as Saviour. Please pray that the entrance of God's Word will continue to give light in this dark, idolatrous region of the world - in a country dominated by Islam. ■

Open Air Ministry


